

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



Superstructures

Installation of transfer beams to support weight of new structures begins
New UAL building (E1) and 34 storey residential tower (E2) up to ground floor
Basement 2 floor completed at two residential buildings (E3)

Start of façade works to residential towers



- Multiplex has now commenced the installation of the Transfer Beams above the Bakerloo Line tunnels.
 The transfer beams will support the load of the new structures
- Concrete core for the E1 (UAL) building is now poured to Level 3
- Concrete core for the E2 (34 storey residential tower) building is now poured to Level 1
- Concrete cores for the E3 (2x residential towers) buildings are now up to Ground Level
- Our last Tower Crane (TC6) is due to be erected in the last quarter of 2023 (Oct-Dec)
- There are currently 4 gates in use across the project and they are managed by teams of dedicated trained traffic marshals
- Multiplex is now installing perimeter scaffold protection gantries
- There are approximately 350 people on site in total, of which 250 are construction operatives
- Multiplex continue to encourage construction operatives to use local businesses

The Multiplex team have been supporting students and local residents on site. Two students from Texas University are undertaking a 8-week internship with the project team, and once completed will share their experience with their classmates. The team have also been supporting local school student Bailey, who is being supported in his ambition to study civil engineering. Multiplex's supply chain partner, Borough Engineering, have also offered local resident Valeria a new role as Document Controller.

Multiplex's Social Value and Community Lead, and Sustainability Manager, also recently hosted two ESG (environmental, social, governance) Supply Chain Workshops to reaffirm the project's ESG commitments.

AGREED ADDITIONAL WORKING HOURS

The Elephant and Castle Town Centre Project has been granted permission by Southwark Council to work over 24-hours to enable the commencement and completion of the integrated ticket hall works. Multiplex plan to work between the hours of 06:00 – 23:00 and will only utilise 24-hour works when necessary. The removal of any debris from the site will not take place beyond 18:00.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

ONSITE CARBON

During April 2023, the project team introduced an electric concrete pump to facilitate the completion of various concrete structures. With the project connected to a renewable tariff, using an electric concrete pump will help to significantly reduce onsite carbon emissions. The pump will also have a positive impact towards both air and noise pollution.

EMBODIED CARBON

During April 2023, the project team have hosted workshops with Aggregate Industries, the project's concrete supplier, to further explore concrete mixes that can facilitate a reduction of the embodied carbon of the concrete structure. Works to achieve this are ongoing.

CLEAN AIR DAY

With Clean Air Day soon approaching (June 2023), Multiplex have decided to present the Elephant and Castle project at the launch of an Air Quality Footprinting Scheme. With the project being a part of the pilot, the project team will be helping to encourage other businesses to better understand their operational impact towards air quality.
