SITE ACTIVITY UPDATE







- Multiplex are due to cast the final transfer beam in the next week which will support new structure above the Bakerloo Line tunnels.
- The concrete core for the E1 (UAL) building is now poured to Level 8 and the concrete core for the E2 (34 storey residential tower) building is now poured to Level 3.
- The concrete cores for the E3 (2x residential towers) buildings are now up to Ground Level and Level 1 respectively.
- The final Tower Crane is due to be erected in the fourth quarter of 2023 between October and December.
- There are currently 4 gates in use across the project and they are managed by teams of dedicated trained traffic marshals.
- Multiplex is now installing perimeter scaffold protection gantries.
- There are approximately 400 people on site in total, of which 300 are operatives and Multiplex continue to encourage operatives to use local businesses.

CONSTRUCTION YOUTH TRUST
