SITE ACTIVITY UPDATE



Superstructures progressing up to level 5 and 6



- Transfer beams that will support the load of the new structure above the Bakerloo Line tunnels are now completed and the Basement 3 slab is being poured above them to begin building the structure out of the ground
- The District Heating Shaft on Elephant Road has commenced
- The concrete core for the E1 (UAL) building has now been now poured to Level 10
- The concrete core for the E2 (34-storey residential tower) building has now been poured to Level 8 and columns are now installed up to Level 6
- The concrete cores for the E3 (2x residential towers) buildings are now up to Level 3
- The last Tower Crane (TC6) is due to be erected in the last quarter of 2023 (Oct-Dec)
- · There are currently four gates in use across the project and they are managed by teams of dedicated trained traffic marshals
- · Multiplex is now installing perimeter scaffold protection gantries along Walworth Road
- · There are approximately 400 people on site in total, of which 300 are operatives

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

BUILDING IN SUSTAINABILITY

The project is targeting various sustainability assessments ensuring the final build operates sustainably and efficiently. On 19th September Final BREEAM Design Stage certificate was achieved. This is the BREEAM 2014 Very Good (Shell & Core) assessment for the Assembly & Leisure area which mainly consists of a Cinema. With this, the design has incorporated energy efficiency and low pollution systems, responsibly sourced materials, and has considered end users' visual and thermal comfort along with other sustainable measures.

RESOURCE EFFICIENCY

As of the end of August 2023, 100% of non-hazardous construction waste has been diverted from landfill. This equates to over 2100m3 of construction waste. 100% of electricity has been supplied via a renewable tariff and as of the end of August 2023, this has led to over 150 tonnes of carbon dioxide being saved. This is the equivalent of taking over 140 cars off the road for one year.

BIODIVERSITY

The project team has arranged a further biodiversity volunteering day and this will take place within Southwark at Peckham Rye Park during October 2023.
