

- KEY:
- 1. New UAL LCC Campus Building: Façade installation is progressing well
- 2. Tower 1 (34 storey residential tower): Bathroom pods have been loaded out up to level 9
- 3. Towers 2 & 3 (22 storey and 20 storey residential towers): Concrete cores are now up to levels 18 and 15 respectively
- 4. Heating Connection: Excavation and tunnelling works for the services tunnel, which will provide the heating link, are complete
- Work continues along Elephant Road to bring the heating connection to the new development and is due for completion soon. Excavation and tunnelling works for the services tunnel are complete, which will provide the link to district heating throughout the development. This has allowed installation of the service duct itself to commence, as well as backfilling works, which have a target completion date of June 2024.
- The concrete structure above the Bakerloo Line tunnels which houses the integrated ticket hall (ITH) has progressed well, with the ground floor concrete slab complete and the level 6 slab now moving forwards. Construction work on the columns and walls within the structure are also progressing well.
- The E1 (12 storey new UAL: LCC campus building) concrete core is complete and floor slabs have

- been poured up to level 11, with level 12 in progress. Installation of the the façade has also commenced to the ground floor and up to level 5 of the north and east elevations. In the building's north and central atriums, four sets of the feature stairs have now been installed.
- The tower 1 (34 storey residential tower) concrete core is now poured to level 26 and concrete floor slabs are now poured up to levels 21 on the south side and 14 on the north side, respectively. The precast façade has progressed to level 6 and bathroom pods have been loaded out up to level 9.
- The tower 2 & 3 (22 storey and 20 storey residential towers) concrete cores are now up to levels 18 and 15, respectively, and concrete floor slabs are now poured up to levels 15 and 11. Early façade panel installation has also commenced, whilst bathroom

- pods have been loaded out up to levels 6 and 2, respectively.
- There are currently three vehicle entry/exit gates and two external pit lanes in use across the project, managed by teams of dedicated trained traffic marshals through Multiplex's supply chain partner, Clipfine.
- Approximately 780 people are working on the project, including roughly 650 operatives and 130 management staff.
- The Multiplex team knows how important it is to engage with the local community through regular neighbourhood liaison. Multiplex continue to encourage their workforce to support local businesses by spending locally.

Multiplex's supply chain partner, James Engineering, has offered an employment opportunity to local residents and is currently conducting interviews.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

WASTE & CIRCULAR ECONOMY

Multiplex's drylining contractor is utilising an off-site prefabrication facility to ensure plasterboard sheets are cut to the correct size, reducing offcuts. Any waste plasterboard will be collected, broken down, and re-entered into the manufacturing process in a closed-loop system, helping to significantly reduce waste.

CARBON REDUCTION

Multiplex continues to explore lower carbon materials, including through the use of a steel reinforcement bar for large amounts of the concrete which has less than a third of the carbon intensity of the average UK equivalent.

BIODIVERSITY

To enhance the ecological value of the site and encourage wildlife back into the area, a variety of bird and bat boxes have been incorporated into the design. A qualified ecologist has been consulted to ensure the greatest ecological impact is achieved.
