


CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



- The E1 (12 storey new London College of Communication building) façade installation is now complete and internal fitout works are ramping up. Finishing works on the roof of the building are ongoing and the atrium skylight is also now complete.
- The tower 1 (34 storey residential tower) façade installation is now complete, along with the installation of bathroom pods. Internal wall construction is now complete up to level 33, and ceilings are being closed at level 14. The installation of flooring and kitchens has also now commenced on level 7.
- On tower 2 (20 storey residential tower) and tower 3 (22 storey residential tower) façade panel
- installation has also now completed. Fit out 'white box', the term used for completion of the walls, floor and ceilings and utilities, has now been achieved up to levels 4 and 5 respectively. Flooring, kitchens and joinery works are all underway on the lower residential floors. The roof crown steel is now complete and final finishing works on the roof are in progress.

4. New UAL: LCC Campus Building: Façade installation complete and atrium skylight installed

- The retail, leisure and workspaces are starting
 to take shape, with façade in these areas being
 progressively installed. Blockwork is now complete
 to the podiums and a range of internal walls will
 begin to be installed in the new year, ahead of
 further custom fit out works to begin.
- There are currently three vehicle entry/exit gates and two external pit lanes in use across the project, managed by teams of dedicated trained traffic marshals through Multiplex's supply chain partner, Clipfine. Three tower cranes have been removed from the project, with a further tower crane due to be dismantled in January 2025. We have recently moved the location of the site office and welfare accommodation to Walworth Road, with the previous site cabins near the Northern Line entrance now removed from site.
- At present, approximately 1050 people are coming to work on the project every day, from operatives (approx. 900) to management staff (approx. 150).

In early December Multiplex hosted a supply chain Directors' meeting to formally launch a new partnership with Bridge of Hope, who will support with brokering Multiplex's employment opportunities for the project. The session was positive with good engagement and interaction from supply chain teams. The employment portal will be live within the next few weeks.

This year, Multiplex collected new toys for KidsOut, a charity which supports children and young people escaping domestic violence and abuse. These were packaged and sent out by 16th December.

Supply chain partner Errigal have recently helped to facilitate 12 new apprentices, taking the total number of apprentices who have worked on the project to 44.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

WASTE AND CIRCULAR ECONOMY

The project is exploring all ways of implementing circular economy principles, including increasing the uptake of supplier take back schemes. These include the Protec closed loop recycling scheme, which reuses plastic protection sheeting, and Dulux's take back scheme for empty paint pots.

RENEWABLE ENERGY

All electricity supplied for the project has been via a renewable tariff, meaning zero direct emissions are accounted for from project electricity use. To date in 2024, this has resulted in a total saving of around 380 tonnes of carbon dioxide.
